## Top Challenges for Missouri's Public Health System

In September 2014 early steps to build the #HealthierMO initiative began with data collection from 360 Missouri stakeholders through online surveys, key informant interviews, stakeholder system mapping, and priority issues identification. Data showed the Missouri public health system:

- lacks a systematic, coordinated approach to the structure, form, scope, and funding of the public health system,
- has great variance in how local public health agencies in Missouri are governed, financed, and supported by the community, and
- continues to face funding cuts, threatening the future of public health in Missouri.

In addition to these fundamental issues, stakeholders have identified other public health challenges.

- Limited access to care / capacity
- Lack of coordinated collaboration
- Inefficient communication
- Lack of timely, relevant, local data
- Lack of sustainable funding streams
- Lack of clear, recognizable leadership
- Barriers to meeting quality assurance, accreditation, and/or performance standards
- Disjointed voice on policy development, legislation, and advocacy
- Gap in workforce development, career laddering, and succession planning
