<p><u>Discussion:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Casey reported that the MAPP Training was rescheduled to August 17-18 at the same location and is limited to 50 attendees. MFH is funding training paying overnight and travel. 2. Minutes from February were reviewed. 3. Dalen announced that some of the items prioritized by Workforce Development Workgroup probably will not happen due to coronavirus outbreak. He suggested that the group could move forward by focusing on the academic part of the continuum and work with academics to implement the new MO FPHS model into curriculums. Jaci shared resources that could be included in University curriculum. Kristin reported that SLU has a couple of classes that could test the module and Dalen thought he could pilot in a class he had at MSU as well. (See possible items for FPHS university curriculum – these modules were intended for undergraduates.) Quiz will have to be mapped to competencies and criteria. Kristin volunteered to discuss with some of her colleagues about coordinating the modules – a graduate student. 4. Jaci reviewed the FPHS academic model which rotates the capabilities to align with the areas of expertise. 5. She also discussed the FPHS gearbox piece which gives more of a description of the model segments. Could adjust this to be more useful to students as well. 6. Linda mentioned the need to consider sustainability and who might take responsibility long-term for maintenance. She mentioned potential of working with the National Library of Medicine and Kristin mentioned HRSA and Region 7 states as potential partners. 7. Kristin reported that PH WINS survey identifies gaps in education/training and demographic information, but maybe not to the level needed in Missouri. 8. Jaci pulled the 2018 DHSS infrastructure report to look at individual questions on education levels of public health staff. 9. Casey reported that the Capacity Assessment will have questions about how each health department would use additional resources and will include hiring people to training people, etc. 	<p><u>Actions:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Get everything in place by the fall semester. Dalen will pilot anything in his summer/fall classes.
